



## SIGHT WORD SENTENCES LIST 5

Just to recap:

1. Once a child has learned how to spell the sight words in LIST 4, you can begin teaching him/her how to write and read these sentences.
2. The suggested time for each sentence is 2 weeks, spending one week on vocabulary and the 2<sup>nd</sup> week on the word family. Spend more or less time according to the child's progress.
3. The child should know how to spell all of the SIGHT WORDS in the sentence before moving onto the next sentence. The underline words DO NOT need to be spelled correctly to move on.
4. The underlined words can be replaced with different words to teach vocabulary.
5. The word families are there to teach a specific spelling pattern.

Which team is better?

Vocabulary: nouns

Word family: beam, cream, dream, team

Try to pull the sled.

Vocabulary: nouns

Teach that 'y' = long I, as in cry, dry, fry, pry, try and fly, my, shy, why

The story is about a bear.

Vocabulary: animals

Teach the 'ou' sound as in out, house, loud, proud, sound etc.

The flowers are pretty.

Vocabulary: nouns

Teach the 'ow' sound as in clown, brown, power, tower, towel etc.

You can draw when you're done.

Vocabulary: verbs

Word Family: claw, draw, flaw, gnaw, law, paw, raw, saw

The boy isn't ready to go.

Vocabulary: verbs

Word Family: boy, joy, Roy, toy,

The girl wasn't well yesterday.

Vocabulary: adjectives

Word Family: bell, fell, sell, shell, tell, well,



May I use the bathroom, please?

Vocabulary: nouns

Word Family: bay, day, hay, May, pay, say, tray, way, x-ray,

The farmer goes into the barn every morning.

Teach time words: afternoon, evening, night, (days of the week) etc.

The chickens aren't out right now.

Vocabulary: farm animals

Review the 'ow' sound: bow, cow, how, plow, vow, wow,

There weren't any sheep on the farm.

Vocabulary: farm animals

Word Family: beep, deep, jeep, peep, seep, sleep, weep

We haven't been there before.

Replace 'been' with other past participle verbs (eaten, gone, played,...)

The baby really liked the milk.

Vocabulary: nouns

Teach that 'y' = long E, as in baby, really, funny, silly, etc.

The woman bakes bread once a day.

Vocabulary: baked goods

Word Family: bread, dead, head, lead, read, tread (short 'e' sound)
