



## SIGHT WORD SENTENCES LIST 7

Just to recap:

1. Once a child has learned how to spell the sight words in [LIST 6](#), you can begin teaching him/her how to write and read these sentences.
2. **At this point, many children can work on 2-3 sentences per week. You can use one that is listed here, plus two that you create based on words your student misspells in his/her free writing.**
3. The child should know how to spell all of the SIGHT WORDS in the sentence before moving onto the next sentence. The underline words DO NOT need to be spelled correctly to move on.
4. The underlined words can be replaced with different words to teach vocabulary.
5. The word families are there to teach a specific spelling pattern.

The old man bought an egg.                      Vocabulary: nouns that begin w/ a vowel  
Word Family: bought, fought, ought, sought, thought

Can I read by myself now?                      Vocabulary: time (today, tomorrow etc.)  
Word Family: ea=long e, bead, lead, plead, read,

Let's watch the plane fly by.                      Vocabulary: things that fly  
Word Family: y=long i, by, cry, dry, fry, fly, my, pry, try, why

How has your brown horse been?                      Vocabulary: animals  
Word Family: brown, crown, drown, frown

They will tell us what to write.                      Vocabulary: verbs  
Word Family: bell, cell, fell, sell, shell, tell, well

Ask him what he thinks.                      Vocabulary: verbs  
Word Family: ask, bask, mask, task

I have never gotten hurt while camping.                      Vocabulary: verbs  
Word Family: file, mile, pile, tile, while

How far did you walk last night?                      Vocabulary: verbs  
Word Family: bright, fight, light, might, night, right, sight, tight



Each person must carry their own bag

Vocabulary: nouns

Word Family: each, beach, peach, reach, teach

Use both hands to hold the chicken.

Vocabulary: nouns

Word Family: bands, hands, lands

How much does the car cost?

Vocabulary: nouns

Word Family: bar, car, far, jar, par, star, tar,

Eight squirrels sleep behind that tree.

Vocabulary: nouns

Word Family: beep, deep, jeep, keep, peep, seep, weep

Just open the door and take out the pizza.

Vocabulary: food

Word Family: door, floor, poor

They gave us cold water to drink.

Vocabulary: drink names

Word Family: drink, kink, link, mink, pink, rink, sink, think, wink
