



REGULAR PAST VERBS THAT END IN --ED

NOTE: This activity can address the following Common Core Standards:
CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.L.1.1.E, L.1.4.C, L.3.1.D, L.3.1.E

Regular PAST verbs end in ED. For example:

Landed
Played
Jumped

However, the ED letters don't make the same sound. Listen to these ED sounds.

The --ED in landeded sounds like ED.

The --ED in playeded sounds like D.

The --ED in jumpeded sounds like T.

For this activity, try to complete the chart below by writing one past ED verb in each box. For each letter of the alphabet, write an ED verb that sounds like ED, D and T. Letter A and Z have been done for you. There are clues at the top of each column to help you as well.

NOTE: For the letter X you can write verbs that begin with the letters EX, such as exclaimed.
