Call to Order.

Last Meeting Minutes Approved.

California 2020 ballot propositions on November 3, 2020 Ballot.

[Proposition 14](#): Issues \$5.5 billion in bonds for state stem cell research institute
NO POSITION.

[Proposition 15](#): Requires commercial and industrial properties to be taxed based on market value and dedicates revenue
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 16](#): Repeals Proposition 209 (1996), which prohibited the state from considering race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin in public employment, education, or contracting
NO POSITION.

[Proposition 17](#): Restores the right to vote to people convicted of felonies who are on parole
NO POSITION.

[Proposition 18](#): Suffrage Allows 17-year-olds who will be 18 at the time of the next general election to vote in primaries and special elections
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 19](#): Changes tax assessment transfers and inheritance rules
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 20](#): Makes changes to policies related to criminal sentencing charges, prison release, and DNA collection.
SURPORTED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 21](#): Expands local governments' power to use rent control.
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 22](#): Considers app-based drivers to be independent contractors and enacts several labor policies related to app-based companies
SURPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

[Proposition 23](#): Requires physician on-site at dialysis clinics and consent from the state for a clinic to close.
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 24](#): Expands the provisions of the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) and creates the California Privacy Protection Agency to implement and enforce the CCPA
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.

[Proposition 25](#): Replaces cash bail with risk assessments for suspects awaiting trial.
OPPOSED UNANIMOUSLY.
