



## AT-HOME LEARNING OPTION 2020-2021

All students will be provided the opportunity to stay 100% online through at-home learning options, even as we move to Phase 4 or higher.

**Families must request a spot for the at-home learning option by contacting the school office prior to August 12, 2020.**

Families are required to commit to a full quarter, at minimum. At the end of the first quarter, families will have the ability to opt back into the building should they wish to do so. Families may also choose to switch to at-home learning at the start of the following quarter.

The online option will match the regular daily schedule for all other students. Teacher's classrooms will be equipped with a Chromebook and students will live stream into their classes from home, and attendance will be recorded as usual. Teachers will only live-stream during whole group/direct instruction. Once the teacher has completed his/her lesson, they will turn off their chrome book in order for students to meet in small groups or work on individual assignments. Once the live streaming ends, your student will complete their assignments at home.

Tuesdays and Thursdays will be dedicated days you may pick up/drop off any school work for your student. All work will be placed in the storage unit that will be placed outside near the main entrance to the school. Each classroom teacher will provide a schedule, zoom login, google classroom info, etc once their schedules are set. Parents will be responsible for logging their student on at scheduled times. Special classes such as PE, Art, Spanish, Music and Band will also be live-streamed on your students' scheduled day.

Students who become sick throughout the school year, are asked to quarantine, or are unable to return to the classroom for other reasons will be able to use the at-home learning option and transition between in- person and online learning throughout the year. Medical documentation is required for this option to occur.

Classes will NOT be recorded. It is pertinent that your student knows their daily schedule and logs in when the class is live-streamed. If schedules need to be changed due to special events, mass, etc...parents will be given prior notice. Teachers will utilize google classrooms and zoom for all students in grades K-8, login information will be forthcoming.

As a school community, we took the results from the AOD parent survey to focus on improving at-home learning. We used the information to understand our parents' and students' experiences during the crisis, and inform us on how to provide a truly academically excellent Catholic education, when it comes to distance learning. As an administrative team, we used the data to improve upon at-home learning in order to continue to provide a quality Catholic education where students will excel whether in school, or at home.

Please note that if you choose at-home learning, it will be rigorous and mimic a typical school day. Your student must be available from 8am-3pm daily. If your student does not log in on any given day, they will be marked absent.

You will receive further information from your student's teacher: logins, books needed to pick up, daily schedule etc..once homerooms have been identified.

For students with an accommodation or NSP plan, they may receive small group, or one-on-one instruction via Zoom with the ASK room teacher.

As you consider which learning model is best for your child, all students will be learning five days a week, and teachers will continue to deliver high-quality instruction that is rigorous and developmentally appropriate for all students, in all learning settings.

Students in grades K-5 will be required to use/purchase their own device for at-home learning.

The deadline was August 10, 2020, but will be extended until Wednesday, August 12, 2020.

This school year will no doubt hold many challenges. However, as people of faith, we remain confident that God is with us to meet every one of those challenges. We need each other more than ever. Remember, as long as our hope is in Him, "hope cannot disappoint."
