THREAT ASSESSMENT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

All reported incidents of threats or intended violence will be taken seriously and investigated according to district policy in cooperation with law enforcement.

- Threats, verbally or in writing, will be consequenced when it can impact the educational environment, results in serious injury, terror, death or property damage.
- A threat assessment is a proactive measure utilizing assessment and intervention processes intended to prevent acts of violence.
- Threat assessments are conducted by a multi-disciplinary team of trained professionals, including the Director of Student Support Services and Safe Schools, a school mental health professional, administrators and the school resource officer or law enforcement.
- Threat Assessment protocol will be completed to determine if the threat is credible or not.
- Disciplinary guidelines will be followed for potential disciplinary consequences in accordance with policy and operating procedures.

How You Can Help

Parents/guardians, please speak to your student(s) about the seriousness of making any comments, “jokes”, or threats. All reported threats will be taken seriously and are prohibited. They will be investigated and consequenced by school officials.

DISCIPLINE REFERENCE CHART

This list is not meant to be exhaustive, but it does include many of the more common and/or serious types of prohibited conduct. Additionally, it establishes guiding discipline consequences for various types of prohibited conduct to be applied by the school's administration.

Assault/Battery toward Staff or Student Fight	K-2	1st Offense: 3-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 2nd Offense: 6-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, May Recommend Expulsion
Assault/Battery toward Staff or Student Fight	3-12	1st Offense: 4-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 2nd Offense: 8-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, May Recommend Expulsion
Single Event - Harrassment/Intimidation/Bullying	K-2	1st Offense: 1 or 2 day Suspension w/re-entry conference 2nd Offense: 4-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, May Recommend Expulsion
Single Event - Harrassment/Intimidation/Bullying	3-12	1st Offense: 3-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 2nd Offense: 6-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, May Recommend Expulsion
Persistent Events - Harrassment/Intimidation/Bullying	K-2	1st Offense: 3-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 2nd Offense: 6-day Suspension w/re-entry conference 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, Shall Recommend Expulsion

Tobacco, Vaping, Look-Alike (Possession, Use, Sell, Furnish)	K-12	1st Offense: 3-day Suspension 2nd Offense: 6-day Suspension 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, May Recommend Expulsion
Extortion, Damages to Property, Robbery, Stolen Goods/Theft	K-12	1st Offense: 3-day Suspension 2nd Offense: 6-day Suspension 3rd Offense: 10-day Suspension, May Recommend Expulsion <i>*More than \$750 can contribute to greater consequences</i>
