### From the Mayor

Welcome Summer!

We are almost done with the construction of the Wastewater Treatment plant, with only a few final punch list items to be completed. Once it has been accepted by the Town, we are planning on an Open House event to offer tours of the new facility. We will follow up with the date once we have it set.

The news from the budget meetings of the County Commissioners is that they have included the construction of a new bathhouse for the Beach in this year's budget, along with a re-do of the steps from the Mary Roe Walkup Pavilion and an attendant to help monitor the Beach area from Thursday through Sunday. We're not sure when construction will begin but would assume that it would be after the Summer season.

Unfortunately, we are still seeing speeds in excess of 50 MPH at the entrance to Town and First Avenue sign is recording speeds in excess of 42 MPH. The average number of violators runs around 20% of those driving into Town. I ask again, as we see the increase of traffic for the Summer days, that you encourage your guests and anyone else you know, to observe the speed limits.

Also, please remember that the trash cans provided by our collector are only for household trash. Appliances and larger items are the homeowner's responsibility and are not to be put in the weekly trash collection.



## From the Desk of the Town Manager

The town has been busy this spring. We have continued to work on the engineering plan for the Shoreline Erosion project on Bayside Blvd. Other projects in town include Wheeler Avenue and the Idlewhile pump station, which are both funded through grants and are set to begin work this summer.

The town is coordinating with the county to have the Bluff by the Rigbie Condos cleared of invasive species, an access road added, and the bank replanted in the late summer/early fall. The town also continues to apply for grant funding to restore the Rigbie Steps – a project that rated as the #1 priority for town residents on the survey that was distributed in March.

In addition, I am pleased to announce that the town was chosen for a Program Open Space grant to put in a new Tree House themed playground at the Sixth Avenue Park. The new playground equipment and safety surface will replace the existing dated equipment and be called the Arbor Play Area. I frequently hear comments from town residents about wanting to attract young families to Betterton, and the new playground will be a beautiful edition.

Betterton is heading in a positive direction. We have seen an increase in home sales in Betterton over the past few months and are pleased to see that 2 blighted properties on Main Street have been purchased and are being made into beautiful homes.



## High Speed Internet

ThinkBig offers 5G internet services to communities via a fiberoptic line. These services are only installed when enough residents of a community sign up for the service. Betterton currently has fiber along most of Main Street. When we get enough households signed up, fiber can be added to our side streets.

## Survey Results

Thank you to the 157 people who returned surveys. Restoration of the Rigbie Steps is ranked as the top project the citizens want to see move forward. We have applied for funding through Community Legacy and will know this fall if it will be funded. Other results indicated that the residents want the town to grow slowly while maintaining the current character. The majority of residents (85%) felt town taxes are fair and 90% felt public services were adequate. Many residents wrote in the comments section that they would like to see a convenience store in town. Results will be used to guide our Comprehensive Plan and Sustainable Communities update.
