Letter from the Supervisor Continued

I have been contacted by both Spectrum and Consolidated Communications and it looks like both will be ready with enhanced services by the end of summer.

Later today, I will be giving testimony in the hearings on the last power outage and how poorly restoration work was handled by all of the electricity providers. I am still working with NYSEG to try to find ways to make the system work better for us during these storms. While I have developed contacts, I am still struggling with getting good information from them. I am hoping these hearings will help get some regulations or standards set that significantly improve the process.

I hope everyone is enjoying participating in some of the NL 200 events. This spring and summer will be busy with NL 200 events, Habitat for Humanity events, Music in the Park, Theater in the Park, and more. It is exciting to see so many things going on in New Lebanon. Check out the rest of the newsletter for more details on these events and ways that you can get involved.

On May 17th at 6:30 p.m. at the New Lebanon Fire House at 523 Route 20 in New Lebanon, the New Lebanon Town Board is holding a public hearing on the proposed private sale by Columbia County of the property located at 16 Lover's Lane, New Lebanon (Tax Map No. 19.2-1-17) to the Corkscrew Rail Train rather than putting this property up for sale through the tax foreclosure bidding process. If you want to express your opinion on this sale, please attend this public hearing or submit your input to the Town Clerk (townclerk@townofnewlebanon.com) no later than May 17, 2018. Columbia County has the authority on the decision but has offered us the opportunity to solicit input from the community and provide them with our recommendation.

There is so much going on and we are always looking for people to get involved. Please let us know if there is an area of interest that you would like to get involved in or some special skill you have that you would like to share. Also, please consider participating in the NL200 events this year; come celebrate the history of our wonderful little town.



Tree Donation Program for Shatford Park

The Town of New Lebanon is offering the opportunity for residents to donate a tree to Shatford Park in honor of a person of your choosing. You can donate a tree of any type (fruit, maple, oak, etc.) and place a memorial plaque in front of the tree in honor of someone. The tree options and prices (including the tree purchase, installation and the cost of the memorial plaque) are: Apple trees (cortland, empire, fireside, freedom, honeygold, frostbite, snow sweet, honeycrisp and winecrisp) are \$200 each; Mount Royal Plum trees are \$200 each; Lapin Cherry Large Mahogany trees are \$200; Maple trees (Crimson King-Red Leafed Norway, Fall Fiesta Sugar, Green Mountain Sugar) range from \$240 - \$370 depending on the type of maple you choose. Get Your Passport to New Lebanon

The goals of the town's bicentennial celebration are building town cohesion, pride and economic development. One of the specific programs to accomplish those goals is the **Passport to New Lebanon**. Twenty-four area businesses and organizations are participating. Each will stamp a holder's Passport when their advertised criteria have been met, such as purchasing an item or even just visiting the location. Persons who collect 12 stamps will be entered into the raffle for fabulous prizes, including an iPad. The raffle will be held at the **Community Picnic August 19**.

Town Clean Up Day

What is Town Clean Up Day? Town Clean Up Day is a one day event held by the Town for its residents to have free access to trash dumpsters to assist them in cleaning up their properties, attics, basements, etc. The dumpsters will be delivered and set up in the Town Hall parking lot in the space between the Highway Garage and the basketball courts. Residents are allowed 2 trips per punch card. There will be a limit of 4 tires per punch card. We do not allow disposal of hazardous materials, household garbage, yard debris such as leaves & tree branches, or electronics. A maximum of a 10 ft. truck or trailer per load.

What to do in advance of Clean Up Day: This year's Town Clean Up Day will be held earlier in the year than previous years. It is on Saturday, May 5, 2018 and will be held rain or shine from 8:00am – 2:00pm at the Town Hall parking area. Punch cards can be obtained from any office at the Town Hall Mon-Fri. Please bring proof of residency (ie: utility bill and driver's license). The fee for the punch card is a non-perishable food donation to Charlie's Pantry. Please be sure to check the expiration dates as expired food is not accepted. If you have any questions please contact the Building Department at 518-794-8884.

The Next KISS Program at the New Lebanon Town Hall

Cemetery of the Evergreens Fundraising Update

In November 2017, the Trustees of the **Cemetery of the Evergreens**, in conjunction with the **Lebanon Valley Historical Society** (LVHS) and the **New Lebanon Town Board**, began a fundraising campaign to restore some stone work on the Tilden Monument. The goal for that effort is \$22,800, based on an estimate from a preservation mason. The three organizations hope to have the contractor complete the restoration in 2018 as part of the NL200 celebration of the 200th anniversary of the chartering of the Town of New Lebanon.

To date, 70 donors have responded, giving both for the Tilden monument and for general cemetery maintenance. The monument amount is nearly \$15,000. The LVHS currently has about \$4,000 from prior solicitations, giving a total of \$19,000 toward the goal. So far, no commitments have been obtained from the State (via our representatives and the governor's office), but Supervisor Colleen Teal is continuing to pressure them for some help. The LVHS will be sending out the annual membership letter in May – there will be a line for donations to the monument, which may bring in more funds.
