A BRIEF HISTORY LESSON



In 1917, Melvin Jones and twelve business men from Chicago, Illinois formed the Lions Club. A few years later, Helen Keller, who was both deaf and blind, spoke to the group and asked them to become Knights

of the Blind. Since then, Lions have supported projects to aid those with sight and hearing problems. In Lacey we have the *Lacey Eyeglass Recycling Center*, which takes donated glasses and fixes them up for people who can't afford glasses, like the Olympia Union Gospel Mission, and medical missions in over 100 countries.
