

Position Opening: Recovery Coach

****This position will be hired through Southwest Wisconsin Workforce Development Board (SWWDB) and “leased” to Green County Human Services. Successful candidates will be an employee of SWWDB and not Green County. ****

Recovery Coach --- Under the supervision of the Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA) Supervisor, the Recovery Coach is to conduct recovery support. The Recovery Coach engages and encourages Recoverees in recovery from substance use disorders. The Recovery Coach provides Recoverees with a sense of community and belonging, supportive relationships, and valued roles. The goal of the Recovery Coach is to promote wellness, self-direction, and recovery, enhancing the skill and ability of recoverees to engage in their chosen roles. The Recovery Coach works with Recoverees as equals. The recovery coach will also support the functioning of the Drug Court Program by assisting the Case Manager/Coordinator with Case Management function such as, but not limited to, coordinating care with outside providers, doing data entry and data processing with outcome reporting systems, and assisting with quarterly and annual grant reporting.

The Recovery Coach will be assigned to work in a Drug Court setting.

Qualifications:

- Identify as a person in substance use recovery.
- Have or able to obtain a recovery coach certification within six months of hire.
- Additionally, essential knowledge and ability to skillfully communicate, relate, and educate people from varying social, economic, cultural and religious backgrounds regarding issues directly and indirectly related to alcohol and other drug prevention.
- A working knowledge of appropriate community support programs and organizations is essential.

Starting Wage: \$14.52/hour.
