



HealthCode Administrative Policy on Indirect Costs for Grant Applications

As a small nonprofit foundation, we seek to be able to pay for expenses that are directly attributable to project outcomes and outputs as direct costs and expenses associated with the general running of our nonprofit business as indirect costs. Examples are costs that would not be incurred if the grant did not exist and are general and overhead administrative costs to support the entire operations. As a result of this we hold ourselves to a limit of 10% of the total award for indirect costs. Our policy is to apply the same 10% limit to our collaborators and partners in a grant.

In cases when HeathCode is the applicant and has responsibility for managing the grant, this policy applies to all sub-recipients in the grant. We seek consistency across funding mechanisms and thus we reserve the right to also apply this philosophy and principle to contracts offered within the grants. For profit entities that sub contract may propose indirect costs as a percentage from 0% up to 10% to the extent that adequate explanation of the cost is provided.
