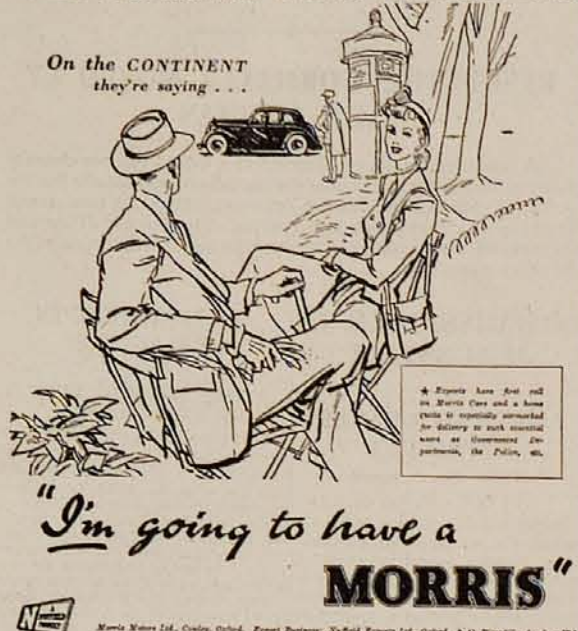

BRITAIN'S MAJOR TASKS

The statement issued by the Colonial Office and the Foreign Office last night on the termination of the Palestine mandate said in part:— The mandate for Palestine was assigned to His Majesty's Government by the League of Nations in 1922...

MOST STRIKING SUCCESS

THE ROYAL COMMISSION

The violence and extent of the rebellion of 1936-39 were unprecedented. The Government appointed a Royal Commission headed by Lord Peel, which recommended that the mandate should be terminated and Palestine divided between the Jews and Arabs.

STATE DEPARTMENT CRITICIZED

WASHINGTON, May 13 The tumult over the Smith-Molotov conversations is dying down, though the post-mortem is long and continues to be critical of the State Department's handling of the situation which developed on Tuesday.

The general feeling can be summed up as follows. General Smith's statement to Mr. Molotov on May 7 was—with the exception of the last two paragraphs—an excellent and much-needed clarification of the official United States policy.

ORDER RESTORED IN THE YEMEN

NEW KING'S FIRM HOLD

FROM OUR ADEN CORRESPONDENT Seif-el-Islam Ahmed, son of the late king, has now consolidated his position as Imam of the Yemen, and the situation there is reported to be calm.

Not only has Ahmed been recognized by all the Arab States, by Pakistan, India, Great Britain, the United States, France, Holland, and Italy, but he has also been recognized by the support of erstwhile claimants to the throne. He is still established at Ta'ez, where he has been visited by a Saudi Arabian mission seeking the settlement of an old territorial dispute.

HOUSE OF LORDS PROFITS FROM SAND PIT: A REVENUE APPEAL

RUSSELL (INSPECTOR OF TAXES) V. SCOTT Before LORD SIMON, LORD PORTER, LORD SIMMONS, LORD NORMAND, and LORD OAKSEY The House dismissed this appeal by the Crown from the decision of the Court of Appeal in Northern Ireland, which raised the question whether the respondent, in connexion with a sand pit, was, as the Crown contended, carrying on a "concern of the like nature" within the meaning of those words in No. III of rule 3 of the rules applicable to schedule A to the Income Tax Act, 1918.

Lord Simon, in the course of his opinion, said that to reach a correct conclusion in this difficult matter it was necessary to examine the language of parts of schedule A with much care. No. I was the General Rule to which No. III, like No. II, was an exception. There was nothing, therefore, in the scheme of the schedule to require that No. III should be given a wider interpretation than its terms on their natural construction required. All that would happen when tax under schedule A was charged "in respect of the property in all lands, tenements, hereditaments, and chattels in the United Kingdom" was that, if the case did not fall within either of the rules which constituted exceptions, it would fall under the general rule No. I and the tax would be calculated on annual value as therein defined.

CANADIAN MERCHANT FLEET

NEW BUILDING PROGRAMME

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT OTTAWA, May 13 Mr. Chevrier, the Minister of Transport, announced to-day that Canada's fleet of ocean-going merchant ships is to be transformed into a modern and well-balanced merchant fleet composed of speedy and up-to-date vessels of different types to meet the requirements of the country's maritime trade.
