

Sermon Review Discussion Questions

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

Every one of us has values that shape the way we make decisions and navigate relationships; they inform what we see as treasure or trash. However, for many of us, they remain invisible or unspoken. As we take this month to recalibrate as a church, we want to think together about the values that shape the kind of people we want to be and the kind of church we want to be. Over the course of the next two weeks, we will look at seven different values. This week, we'll begin with three: (1) the gospel, (2) scripture, and (3) prayer.

Discussion Questions

1. What is one "treasure" you possess that someone else would most certainly see as "trash"? Share why you value the item so much. What are some ways we can identify what a person, community, or organization values?
2. Why is it integral for the gospel to be one of our core values? How would you define the gospel? What are ways that you see this core value reflected in the life of Grace Church? What are ways you see this core reflected in your own life?
3. What is it about Scripture that makes it inherently valuable? How have you seen the transforming power of Scripture at work in your life? How should holding Scripture as a core value impact the way we operate as a church?
4. How has prayer grown your faith in and dependence on God? What difference would it make for us to seek to fulfill the mission of God apart from prayer? What are some bold prayers we might ask God to accomplish in the life of our church?
5. To what extent should these core values be reflected in all churches and Christians? What are some practical steps you can individually take to grow these values in your own life? How would you hope to see the gospel, scripture, and prayer become more valuable to those in your life?

In-Sermon Focus Questions

These questions are designed to keep you engaged during the sermon.

1. What are values? How do they function in our lives?
2. What is the gospel?
3. What does it mean to be “gospel-centered”?
4. Why do we want to be scripture-saturated? In light of that, what should we do?
5. How can we live out our prayerful-dependence on God?
