**THIS WEEK'S  
MEMORY VERSE IS  
JOHN 20:31**

“But these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name”  
John 20:31

**Work on committing this verse to memory and thinking about it this week.**

*What part of studying the book of John has most helped you to believe or consider believing in Jesus. What does John say is the reason he wrote these things—not just that you would believe but also for what end result?*

**REVIEW TODAY'S MESSAGE BY DISCUSSING THESE QUESTIONS AS A FAMILY:**

1. Read John 20 together as a family. Retell the events of this passage in your own words. Where are these events taking place? How are people responding to these events? What is Jesus communicating about Himself through His actions and words in this passage? What are other people (Mary, Thomas, the other disciples) communicating about their hearts toward Jesus through their actions and words?
2. John puts a lot of emphasis in his resurrection account on the senses—especially what they SAW. Read back through John 20 and make a list of everything John notes that the disciples or Mary saw and every time you see the world saw/see/seen. Note also how many times a mention of seeing is connected to mention of believing. In John's first epistle (1 John 1:3) he emphasizes that he can proclaim this message because he was a witness who saw and heard the things of Jesus. But in verse 29 of today's passage, Jesus tells Thomas, "Blessed are those who have NOT SEEN and yet have believed". As someone who did not see these things take place, why do you think Jesus says that those who didn't see and yet believe are more blessed?
3. What is the reaction of the various people in this story when they realized Jesus has been resurrected? What do Peter and John do? What does Mary do? What does Thomas say? What is YOUR response to Jesus being resurrected? Do you believe Jesus has been raised from the dead and conquered death forever? Who can you go to and tell about this good news?
