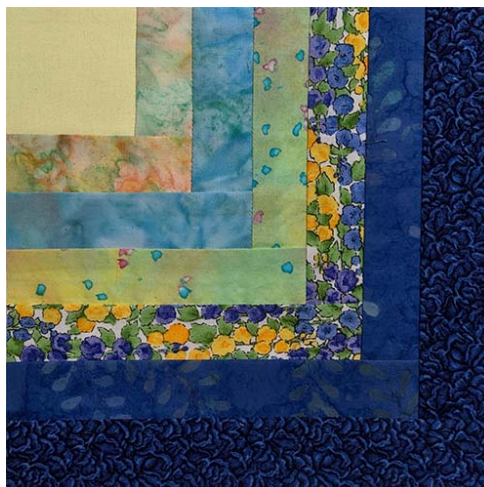


## House on the Corner BOM June 2021

The first block we'll be doing is as easy as it gets.

Traditionally, log cabin blocks have a center square, which is red, with strips of light and dark on either side of the square. Each month, our block patterns will be a little different. So I used different prints and values in this block, rather than light value on one side and dark value on the other. I hope you will have fun playing with color too!



This 7" square is called Cornerstone Block, Quarter Log Cabin, Corner Log Cabin, and many more. I just renamed it here to fit with the theme of our BOM.

The pattern has been adapted from a 1997 book *101 Log Cabin Blocks* by Linda Causee.

You'll notice I used the same fabric twice (i.e. #2 & #3 strips, #4 & #5 strips, etc).

Remember that your fabric strips don't need to be exact, just long enough to cover the space, with at least ¼" seam allowance all the way around. Always make the strips bigger than you think they should be and you won't have to rip out any stitches.

I cut the corner square fabric 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" square.

My strips were at least 1-1/2" wide (they can be wider if that's what you have)

Strip #2: 2-1/2" long	Strip #8: 5-1/2" long
Strip #3: 3-1/2" long	Strip #9: 6-1/2" long
Strip #4: 3-1/2" long	Strip #10: 6-1/2" long
Strip #5: 4-1/2" long	Strip #11: 7-1/2" long
Strip #6: 4-1/2" long	Strip #12: 7-1/2" long
Strip #7: 5-1/2" long	Strip #13: 8-1/2" long
