Chris Via Wins US Open



Global Rumble Champion To Be Crowned On Saturday April 17

On March 1, over 5,000 bowlers across 20 countries entered the first-ever PBA Bowlero Global Rumble powered by Lanetalk. Now after 68,000 games bowled and over 30,000 hours of competition, just 12 players remain in contention to become the first-ever champion and win the first-place prize of \$10,000.

The 12 finalists will all compete on Saturday, April 17th, and have one attempt to bowl their best two consecutive games submitted to Lanetalk. The bowler with the highest combined two-game total will be the winner!

The first-of-its-kind worldwide competition has been thrilling and the 12 remaining players across the six conferences proved that there is immense talent across the globe. Seven players even rolled perfect 300 games to advance to the Grand Finale.

Chris Via won his first career Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour title by defeating Jakob Butturff in the championship match of the 2021 U.S. Open, 214-213. Via, who has qualified for five of the last seven televised major championship finals, also earned the fifth and final spot in the PBA Super Slam, which will air live on FOX Broadcast Channel April 18 at 12:30 p.m. ET.

Via joins Kyle Troup (PBA Players Championship), François Lavoie (PBA Tournament of Champions), Tom Daugherty (Guaranteed Rate PBA World Championship) and Thomas Larsen (USBC Masters) in the Super Slam field.

The PBA Super Slam, a special event paying \$100,000 to the winner, will feature all five major champions from the 2021 Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour season bowling a single game to determine seeding. The player with the lowest score will be eliminated and the four surviving players will be seeded into the semifinals.
