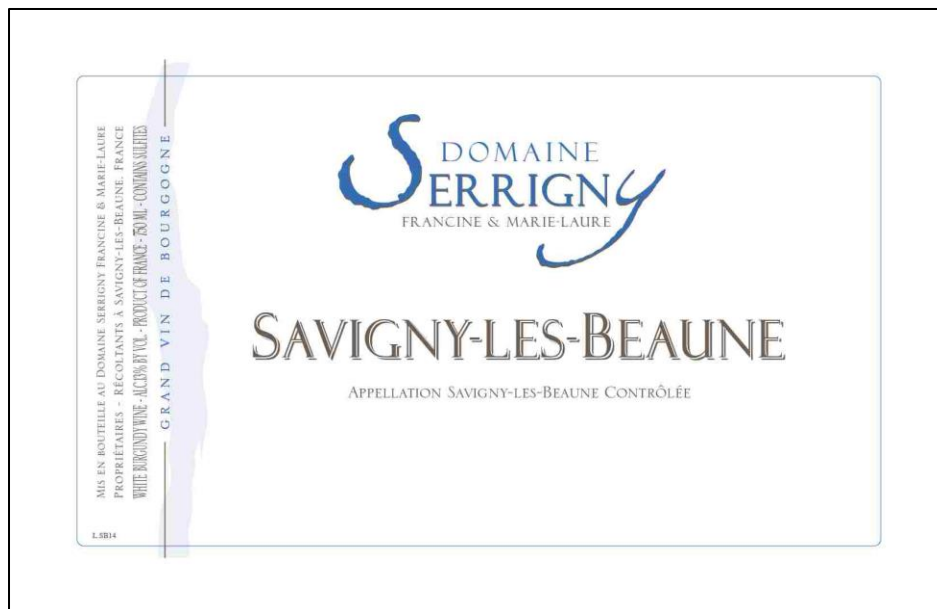


Domaine Serrigny Savigny-les-Beaune



Savigny-les-Beaune Blanc 2015

The 2015 Savigny-lès Beaune Blanc from Domaine Serrigny is one of the few wines in their lineup that does not come from old vines, as the majority here were planted in 1989 and 2008. Marie-Laure Serrigny allows her wines to see no new oak, so the Savigny Blanc is raised in older casks for twelve months before being racked into tank to finish its élevage. The 2015 version is excellent, offering a deep and precise bouquet of apple, pear, chalky soil tones, beeswax, hazelnuts and just a whisper of vanillin oak. On the palate the wine is crisp, full-bodied and complex, with fine depth at the core, sound framing acids and impressive length and grip on the very well-balanced finish. The amplitude of the 2015 vintage is quite evident on the palate here, but the wine has lovely structure and stays light on its feet. A fine example! 2018-2025+
