**The Objective (“The Why”):** Riverview High School Foundation currently provides three dropout prevention initiatives. Riverview’s Efforts to Assist Children at Home (REACH), was created to help RHS students who may fall short on their academic potential due to their basic needs not being met, including clothes, shoes, proper nutrition and funds for required school activities. Currently the REACH program has a food pantry, clothes closet and a benevolent fund to help meet these deficiencies quickly, better ensuring academic success. Riverview’s Academic Mentoring Program (RAMp) identifies incoming freshmen who are in need of academic assistance to assure that they can succeed at Riverview and graduate as productive citizens and succeed in life. And the Cyesis Parenting Student Program’s goal is to increase the likelihood that pregnant and parenting students will earn a high school diploma. The focus is always on quality and early intervention to improve young lives. The long term goal involves supporting all our students physically, socially and emotionally while achieving 100% graduation rates and 100% college and career ready rates.

**Mission:** To expand the RHSF’s academic intervention strategies.

**The Need:** Based on data, Riverview’s academic priorities involve increasing the success of each and every student at Riverview. Our goal is to graduate 100% of our students by supporting them and embracing their changing needs. The interventions needed by our students are as diverse as our student body. Riverview intends to bring its pockets of excellence to scale and ensure that every child has the opportunity to receive an outstanding education.

Funding needed for Academic Interventions

- AP study materials for underprivileged students
- Teacher stipends to support student learning and successful pass rate of AP students
- ACT and SAT remediation for students to successfully pass the FSA 10<sup>th</sup> grade graduation requirements
- Teacher stipends for ACT and SAT remediation
- Teacher stipends to support remediation of CTE students to increase the levels of proficiency
