EAC 2019

- EAC voted unanimously to retain Harmonie Hawley as the alternate EAC member. (Post meeting note: Ms. Hawley has resigned from the EAC per the request of her new employer.)
- Ms. Heisey & Mr. Cram reviewed the draft results of the Pickering Preserve Walk-thru with David Steckel on Monday 22Jul2019.
- Tree Ordinance Update
 - Mr. Mentry discussed the BOS request to create a Township Tree Protection Ordinance. The draft was taken from East Pikeland's ordinance. It is under review by Planning Commission and Ann Hutchinson from Natural Lands. The EAC discussed their thoughts of the ordinance, how will it be enforced, how will the residents be informed, how did East Pikeland roll it out, when will it be rolled out. BOS requested EAC provide written comments ASAP.

- o Montgomery County 100% Clean Energy Code
