Nature Center at Shaker Lakes Camp Hygiene Protocol

Below is a list of guidelines to be followed by campers and educators during the camp day to prevent the spread of disease.

1. All campers, educators, volunteers and parents are expected to follow the Outdoor Adventure Camp Communicable Disease Prevention guidelines. (This is a separate document detailing health monitoring expectations).
2. Camp groups are capped at 8 campers this year. NCSL reserves the rights to increase this number should CDC guidelines and NCSL policy allow.
3. Buckets with rags and cleaners will be kept in each classroom out of reach of our youngest campers.
4. High-touch surfaces will be wiped down by a volunteer or educator during lunch and at the end of each camp day. These surfaces include but are not limited to:
 - a. Table tops - paper, even if unsoiled, should be thrown out each day
 - b. Door knob
 - c. Sinks/faucets
 - d. Bathrooms (multiple cleanings a day)
5. The use of the following camp supplies will be limited to keep cleaning routines efficient:
 - a. Plush toys will be removed from all classroom spaces.
 - b. All other toys and games that can be cleaned will be on rotation to ensure they are disinfected frequently.
 - c. Craft supplies will be used sparingly.
6. Hand sanitizer will be available in each classroom and hand washing will be done multiple times each day for 20 seconds including, but not limited to:
 - a. Upon arrival
 - b. After free-play
 - c. Before and after lunch
 - d. After being outside
 - e. Before and after snack time
 - f. Before pick-up
7. Whenever possible, campers will eat lunch outside. If indoors, windows and fans will be used to increase ventilation and careful attention will be given to spacing between campers.
8. All campers, educators, volunteers and parents are expected to wear a mask during drop-off, pick-up and during the camp day.
