

WATERMARKING IMAGES

This method will always place the created watermark in the image center , and at the correct size , no matter what the image size is.

1. First we will create a watermark on a blank file which is much larger then we will ever need.
Go to File>New and create a blank document which is 7000pix by 7000pix and 300ppi ,RGB, 8bit.
2. From custom shapes in PS choose the copyright symbol and place it in the center of the blank document. Size it 3000 by 3000.
3. Go to the layers palette and click on “Add a Layer Style”. Choose “bevel and emboss” from the list. Feel free to adjust the sliders to make the symbol lighter or darker. On left side , click on “blending options” and bring the fill slider to near zero. Then click OK. Drag the Background layer to the trash and save the document as a PSD where ever you choose to save it.
4. Next open the image to be watermarked and we will now create the action.
5. Go to the actions palette and click the “Create New Action” icon. Name the action and click “record”
6. Go to “File>Place”. When the Place dialog box opens , locate the watermark file you saved. Click on it , then click on “Place”. The watermark will be placed on the image. Press enter .
7. Save the image by choosing “File>Save As” and select jpeg.
8. Click on the little empty square to the left of the Save step. Click on it to turn on the Toggle Dialog On and Off setting. This allows you to pick a different file name each time you run the action.
9. Click the “Stop Recording” button and you are done.
