SCIENCE COMES ALIVE Reporter: Mishal

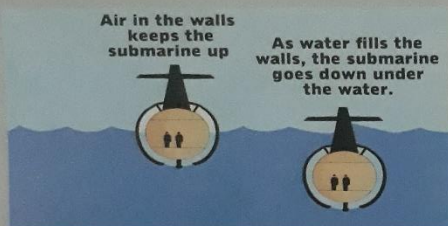
