Every year, dozens of Miniature Schnauzers end up in animal shelters – some are strays, some have been surrendered by their owners. Many of these Schnauzers are scared, confused and some are even suffering from injuries or illness. In some cases, some of these dogs are close to being euthanized.

Miniature Schnauzer Rescue of North Texas (MSRNT) monitors these shelters, looking for Schnauzers in need of new and loving “forever homes.” In addition, we accept Schnauzers whose owners can no longer keep them because of financial hardship, the death of a loved one or any other reason.

msrnt's rescue operations

When a Miniature Schnauzer is rescued by MSRNT, we become responsible for the dog until it is adopted. We assess each Schnauzer and work with the dog, according to its needs, including:



- A complete physical exam by a licensed veterinarian.
 - All vaccinations, including rabies, are brought up to date.
 - Dogs are checked for parasites, including heartworm.
 - Necessary dental treatment is provided.
 - Illnesses or medical problems are treated.
- During foster care, we provide monthly heartworm, flea prevention and any necessary medications, and the foster volunteers evaluate our Schnauzers for behavior and social traits, thus providing a proper match when placing them in a forever home.
- All dogs are spayed or neutered before adoption.

foster homes - a loving, caring step before adoption

While under our program, rescued Schnauzers live in loving and caring environments until they are ready – both physically and emotionally – to move into their new forever homes. Foster volunteers spend many hours socializing, housebreaking and teaching them basic commands.

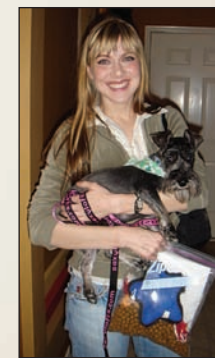

how to adopt a Miniature Schnauzer from msrnt

All adopters must complete an application that provides information used by MSRNT to thoroughly screen all prospective owners. This ensures that every dog will go to an appropriate home that meets our adoption criteria. Adopted animals must be kept current on vaccines and heartworm prevention. They must not be chained or tied to trees or fences, kept in garages, etc. They must be



housedogs – not exclusive yard dogs. If a new owner is unable to keep an adopted animal, the dog must be returned to MSRNT – it cannot be sold, traded or disposed of in any way.
