is the education manager for the Chicago Alliance Against Sexual Exploitation. He holds a bachelor's degree from Syracuse University, where he studied education and theatre.

He began working with [CAASE](#) in 2007, helping to research the behavior of men who buy sex in the Chicago area. Caleb began facilitating CAASE's curriculum *Empowering Young Men to End Sexual Exploitation* in March 2010.



CAASE created the curriculum as a result of the 2007 research project, and it is the nation's first prevention curriculum to engage young men in dialogue about the sex trade and demand, empowering them to stand as allies against sexual exploitation and violence. To date, more than 2,300 young men in Chicago have completed the program, and that number is continuing to grow each week.

In addition to his work in the classroom, Caleb has co-authored anti-trafficking curricula for the Frederick Douglass Family Initiatives and has presented at numerous conferences around the United States and Canada. He has also been educating the community at-large through theatre since 2008, when he began writing, directing, and producing plays that address the causes and consequences of commercial sexual exploitation, and facilitating post-show discussions. Caleb is a husband and father of twin boys.
