Dear Trinity Family,

“Be shepherds of God’s flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.” 1 Peter 5.2-4 NIV

Recently, while flying out of Heathrow, a fellow passenger asked J. John “What do you do?” He responded, “WELL, I work for a Global Enterprise. We’ve got outlets in nearly every country of the world. We’ve got hospitals, and hospices, and homeless shelters. We do marriage work, we’ve got orphanages - we got feeding programs, educational programs. We do all sorts of justice and reconciliation things. Basically, we look after people from birth to death and we deal in the area of behavioral alterations.”

She went, ‘Wow!’ so loudly that people’s heads turned to look. Then she asked, “What’s it called?”

J. John<sup>1</sup> said, “It’s called the Church! Have you heard of it?”

Job descriptions are often difficult, especially for pastors. When asked what he does, J. John says, “It’s always very difficult to know what to say. Cause if I say to you that I am a Reverend, which I am, that conjures up certain images in people’s minds of what I might be.” I’m sure each of you also has a mental picture of what a priest or pastor should be. Hopefully, it is a realistic one.

Since the ‘70’s and ‘80’s, the role of pastor has often been based on the success of the megachurch, with the model pastor being CEO, chief Visionary, and Fundraiser extroardinare.

While every pastor struggles in part to fill these expectations, these should never be his/her chief role. God calls us to be shepherds of his flock: teachers, preachers, counselors, caregivers, and faithful ministers of the Christ’s Sacraments. Lead on Lord Christ!
