There is a lot of work that goes into these projects, including tons of phone calls, making sure the information for the Directory is correct, and being there for the photo shoots. In the end, we will have a new and updated directory!

This past Tuesday, Trinity Baptist hosted Lake Area Ministry's 30th Anniversary luncheon. The food was great and Dr. Farmer was the keynote speaker. I am not sure of the exact count, but I would venture there were 200 to 250 present. This past Monday/Tuesday I attended the Fall Clergy Conference at Camp Weed. You may envision a bunch of old guys sitting around in black shirts and collars, listening dutifully to the Bishop, but in fact, it's quite the opposite. Young and old, male and female casually dressed, gathering for lunch and dinner and informative sessions; meeting old friends, sharing ideas with one another, and yes, of course, hearing a bit from our Bishop.

At the Tuesday morning session, The Rev. Dr. Marcia King, Associate Rector at St. Peter's Episcopal, Fernandina, presented a program designed to read the entire Bible in 90 days. Called "B90," this life-changing challenge takes us through the entire bible in 90 days – a great Lenten Program that we will begin in January and end in time for Easter.

The "B90 - Read the Bible" features its own NIV Bible with numbered pages and each day's readings clearly marked. There is a one hour class each week – at a convenient time for you, featuring a DVD presentation from respected Bible scholars to offer context and notes on the lessons, and time for small group and general discussion of your experiences and questions concerning the readings that week.
