What is He the head of?

What dwelt in Him?

Read Ephesians 4:11-14. Why did God give His body differently gifted people?

What is the ultimate goal for us to attain?

Then we will no longer be carried away by what?

Read Colossians 1:26-29. What was revealed to the saints?

What was that mystery?

Underline or circle all the action verbs in verse 28. What do we proclaim?

Whom do we warn?

What do we teach?

What is our goal state for our presentation to Christ?

Read 1 John 3:2. What is the promise that we will “done day be” in this verse?

How does that line up with Ephesians 4:11-14 and Colossians 1:26-29 above?

As you spend time with God today, ask Him to help you to see that His goal is for us to become more like Christ every day. Ask Him to help you to love His word, to meditate on it, to hunger for it.
