



Lesson 21
“Walk Away”
Romans 7:1-6
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Read John 15:1-11. There are two types of branches that Jesus describes in this passage. What are they?

List what characteristics each of the branches has. List what “end” each branch can expect.

If we abide in Christ, what will our wishes be? (Hint: Forget about the car.)

How does this line up with what Jesus says in verses 9-11?

How is God glorified through the fruitful branches?

Read Galatians 2:19-21. What does Paul say we have died to here?

Why did we die to this?

Who is it, according to Paul, that now lives in the Christian?

Look at the end of verse 20: which came first, Christ dying for us or Christ loving us?

If we were able to make ourselves righteous through keeping the law, what would have been without purpose?

Read Galatians 6:7-8. What does it mean to mock God?

What will we reap if we sow to our flesh?

How does this point back to an attempt to mock God?

What do we reap if we reap to the Spirit?

Read Galatians 5:22-24. Notice that this list is not something you can will yourself to accomplish. What does verse 24 say those who belong to Christ have done?

Now, read Galatians 5:16-21. Contrast these with the list in verses 22-23. What stands out to you?

As you spend time with God today, ask Him to help you to see where you are still a slave to sin. Ask Him to help you to hate the sin you once loved, and to love and desire the things that God values. Ask Him to remind you that you are no longer dead in your sin when you are in Christ and ask Him to continue to guide you in the new way He wants you to go.
