INTERCONTINENTAL – HÔTEL DIEU

Guided walking tour of “Le Panier” district:

“Le Panier” designates a district of Marseille located in the 2nd arrondissement, divided between three administrative districts: Hôtel-de-Ville, Les Grands-Carmes and La Joliette. The name of the basket would come from an inn with a basket as its sign. It gives its name to the street where it is established, rue du Panier, then to the neighborhood.



Guided tour of the work of “Le Corbusier - la cite Radieuse”

The “Cité radieuse”, “Le Corbusier” or more colloquially “La Maison du fada” is a residence built between 1947 and 1952 by architect Charles-Édouard Jeanneret, born at La Chaux De Fonds (Switzerland) on October 6, 1887, and known by the pseudonym Le Corbusier (1887-1965). La Cité Radieuse is located at 280 boulevard Michelet in Marseille in the Sainte-Anne district, in the 8th arrondissement. Built in the form of a bar on stilts (in the form of flared legs with a brutalist appearance), it attempts to concretize a new form of city, a “vertical village” called “Housing unit”. The residence has 337 apartments of 23 different types separated by “interior streets” (the “standard” apartment is duplex) and a hotel with 21 rooms. The site is listed, along with sixteen other architectural works by Le Corbusier, on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 2016. **(the number of places is limited).**



Guided tour of the “Marius Fabre” soap factory.

Since 1900 and four family generations, in the heart of Salon-de-Provence, the Marius Fabre soap factory has been perpetuating the artisanal manufacture of Marseille soap and black soap with olive oil.

ALL ATTENDEES TOUR:



Guided tour of the “Château d’If” – Count of Monte Cristo: *Saturday afternoon*

The Château d'If is a French fortress built on the orders of King François I between 1527 and 1529 on the If island of the Frioul archipelago, near the islands of Ratonneau and Pomègues in the center of the harbor of Marseille. It is a square three-storey construction measuring 28 meters on each side, flanked by three towers, pierced by large embrasures.

The rest of the island, whose size is only 3 hectares, is strongly defended; high ramparts with artillery platforms surmount the cliffs. It essentially served as a prison during its 400 years of official use. Made famous by Alexandre Dumas' novel, the count of Monte-Cristo, it is one of the most visited sites in the city of Marseille (nearly 100,000 visitors per year). It was classified as a historic monument on July 7, 1926.



Dinner at Restaurant le MIRAMAR “Bouillabaisse” - Typical fish dish: *Saturday evening.*

Bouillabaisse is a traditional and institutional culinary specialty of Mediterranean Provence cuisine.

Originally from Marseille, of which she is an emblem, it consists of a fish soup accompanied by bread croutons rubbed with garlic and spread with “special sauce”, pieces of fish, and potatoes.



ARLES – Camargue



The museum of ancient Arles:



The inexhaustible wealth of monuments that the soil of the city of Arles has delivered is undoubtedly one of the factors that aroused the curiosity and interest of an entire population very early on.

From the 16th century, amateurs, curious, Arles antique dealers constituted veritable cabinets of curiosity. In 1614, the first presentation of a public collection of antiques was organized at the "Maison commune". Public heritage awareness asserted itself in the 17th century, when a decree ordered that the product of any discovery be deposited in this place.

OLD TOWN TOUR – Arles:



Arles is a city located near the Rhône, in the Provence region in the south of France. She is renowned for having inspired the paintings of Van Gogh, who influenced contemporary art exhibited at the Vincent Van Gogh Foundation. Formerly the provincial capital of ancient Rome, Arles is also renowned for its many ruins dating from this era, including the amphitheater of Arles, which now hosts plays, concerts and bullfights.

MANADE LAURENT – Les Marquises:



"All the Nobility of the Camargue". For 4 generations, the Laurent family has shaped this area. Sheltered from time, she stubbornly maintains an authentic lifestyle close to nature, devoted to the seasons, to bulls and horses. This protected place is not closed. The Manade opens its doors to you for an exceptional discovery.

Guided tour of the museum, the Manade and meals are included.
