The Hanover Area Historical Society was founded in 1965 by local citizens. The Society's mission is to protect and promote the historical heritage of the greater Hanover area. HAHS will selectively acquire, preserve and provide access to historical buildings, sites, artifacts and archives that have unique historical significance for this area. In addition, the Society will provide related programs and activities for the educational, recreational and cultural benefit of the people of the greater Hanover Area.

Some History about the Historical Society



In 1974, the Society purchased and restored the **Neas House** at Chestnut and High Streets. All the funding for the purchase and the repairs came from the community. The House is open for tours by appointment only.

In 2007, the Society was given the **Warehime-Myers Mansion** at 305 Baltimore Street. The Mansion is open for public tours Wednesdays 10:00-3:15 and Saturdays 12:00-3:15. (Please arrive by 2:00.) Rental space is also available.

The carriage house behind the Mansion holds our brand new (2020) **Hanover Area History Museum**. Hours for the Museum are the same as for the Mansion.

The Society's business offices and the **Yelland Research Library and Archives** are located at 21 Baltimore Street. The Yelland Library offers a varied collection of resources pertaining to the area's history. These resources are available to the public by appointment only.
