

SECTION 1: the 71 +/- tract of the "Hartig Park" shall be designated as Watershed Restoration Area (WRA) as it is in the best interest of Gallatin County, the "Hartig Park" and the purposes set forth in the original deed whereby Gallatin County received said property and if there are any conflicting restrictions Gallatin County exerts its authority under the granting deed to adopt "additional reasonable rules and regulations," such as those set forth in the deed covenants creating the "Hartig Park" Watershed Restoration Area, for the use of the "Hartig Park" property by the public, consistent with the original purposes and restrictions;

SECTION 2: All paperwork necessary to create the Watershed Restoration Area (WRA) with in the "Hartig Park" be completed and signed by Gallatin County Judge Executive Jon Ryan Morris on behalf of Gallatin County, Kentucky including the granting of a deed with covenants as required to create the WRA by Louisville District Corp of Engineers (Corp) in consultation with an Interagency Review Team (IRT) comprised of representatives of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Kentucky Fish and Wildlife, and the Kentucky Division of Water (KDOW) Funds were provided from the Northern Kentucky Stream and Wetland Restoration Program for the purpose of compensatory mitigation of Aquatic resources.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of the Gallatin County Fiscal Court concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in open meetings of the Fiscal Court, and that all deliberations of the Gallatin Fiscal Court that resulted in such formal actions were in compliance with all legal requirements, and the Codified Ordinances of the County of Gallatin.
