



Hannah Davis testified that her husband Jonathan Davis was killed at Camden in October 1780 on or about the 16th. Their son Jonathan C Davis was born 28Oct1780.

William Hill, Secretary of State of North Carolina certified that the heirs of Jonathan Davis were granted 640 acre land warrant 3458 in 1786, the proper award for the heirs of one who died in service.

In 1839, Jonathan C Davis testified that his mother had visited both Kings Mountain and Camden with other Whig ladies of the years after the war to inquire of the locals about their fallen spouses. Since she had a fix on the October date, he was certain that his father had died at Kings Mountain. Further he had a scrap of a letter from his dad dated 05Oct1780 from Cowpens.

Jonathan Davis was known in Rowan County NC as a schoolmaster, a successful businessman, and an English scholar.

Known to have been a patriot killed in action, known to have been killed in October 1780, from the area where Colonel Williams was recruiting, at Cowpens when Williams' troops were there, we have strong evidence that Jonathan Davis was killed at Kings Mountain 07Oct1780.
