



**John Wallace** was born 22Dec1757. He enlisted in militia service in Sullivan County NC (now TN). Wallace married Martha Thompson. They moved to Blount County TN for 25 years, then to Bibb County AL. They had children Matthew, Robert, Pulaski, Nancy, Mahaley, and William. John Wallace died 18Jun1847 and was buried off Hwy 25 in Six Mile, Bibb County AL.

John Wallace served in Captain John Topp's militia company under Colonel Isaac Shelby. On 07Oct1780, John Wallace received two wounds at the Battle of Kings Mountain. John Wallace is not listed among the heroes on the 1909 plaque honoring patriot casualties at Kings Mountain National Battlefield.

Captain Roger Topp's Sullivan County NC militia company operated in the Carolinas under Col McDowell until the Fall of 1780 when they were transferred to the "care" of Colonel Isaac Shelby. Wallace stated that he was under Shelby on 07Oct1780.

From John's pension declaration: "that himself, George Rutledge, John Scott, James Duncan, Simeon Elliott, Daniel Morris, and Adam Cooper being 7 young man residing in the same neighborhood and being intimately acquainted, to wit, in Sullivan County as stated in the declaration all mutually agreed to go together and joined the State Troops of North Carolina."
