

William Hodge was born 01Apr1762 in York County, PA to William and Elizabeth Cook Hodge. He volunteered for militia service in Ninety Six District, SC, in May 1778 and joined the company of Captain John Thompson in Colonel Thomas Brandon's regiment. They maneuvered around South Carolina and were in various skirmishes until 16Jan1781 when they joined General Daniel Morgan's army. Captain Thompson's horsemen joined Colonel William Washington's dragoons in the battle at the **Cowpens**, routed the British and chased them several miles to old Gaudilocks (maybe Adam Gaudilock's farm in Union District). **Hodge was wounded**, but after he recovered he returned to service under Captain Jacob Barnett. In 1782, Hodge was wounded again in a detachment guarding General Isaac Huger. .

In Mar1790, Hodge married Ann Saye. They moved to Madison County GA. In 1809, William was an elder at Pisgah Presbyterian Church when it was organized near Danielsville. He applied for a pension (FPA (W4233) in Clarke County as a Madison County resident. Hodge provided supporting testimony for the pension application of Charles Smith in Franklin County Ga and Levi Wallace of Newton County, GA. William Hodge died 19Dec1836 in Madison County.
