

Thomas Moore applied for a hardship pension (FPA S1858) in Rhea County TN on 03May1825 at age 78. Moore enlisted in the new southern army in 1780, but before reaching Charleston, the British had captured it. He was in the battles at Camden and Kings Mountain. He was discharged at the battle of the **Cowpens** 17Jan1781 after having his **thumb cut off** by a bullet & also receiving a wound in the thigh which rendered him unable to perform service. When he recovered, he re-enlisted and was in the battle at Guilford Courthouse.

In Sep1832, at age 101, in Rhea County, TN, Thomas Moore applied for a Revolutionary War veteran's pension. Form that deposition:

He enlisted in Granville County NC in Captain Casey Bullock's company and marched to Camden SC. His company was under Baron DeKalb at Gates' Defeat. Moore named several other engagements. Unlike his 1829 deposition, this time he did **not mention Cowpens**, but stated that he was wounded at **Eutaw Springs**.

Moore received a pension rated at 21 months as a private and 3 months as a sergeant in the North Carolina militia.
