

In *The Patriots of the Cowpens*, Bobby Gilmer Moss listed soldiers of Delaware and Maryland which he researched in Delaware archives. After Gates' defeat at Camden, General Nathaniel Green pieced together a new southern army. Under General Daniel Morgan, some of the Delaware Continental Line under Captain Robert Kirkwood joined with Colonel John Eager Howard of Maryland's 5th Continental Line.

Andrew Pollard was one of the Delaware soldiers, a private in Captain Kirkwood's company from 1777. Rosters show him receiving a coat, a hat, and rations in addition to his pay. On 17Jan1781, Pollard was **wounded through the arm** in the Battle at the **Cowpens**. Andrew stayed with the movements of his company though unfit to serve. In April1781 Pollard was listed in Kirkwood's company of Colonel David Hall's Delaware regiment. Pollard was still on Kirkwood's roster, but not fit for duty in Mar1783.

In 1791, Pollard remained on the list of Delaware invalids from the Revolution and was paid \$5.00 per month.
