

#### What is a TIP?

- Tribal Implementation Plan (TIP)
  - Air quality plan developed by the tribe to help attain and/or maintain national air quality standards (NAAQS) for common air pollutants
- Treatment as State (TAS)
  - Treated in same manner as states by EPA
- Tribal Authority Rule (TAR)
  - Eligibility criteria for TAS

### Tribal Authority under TAS

#### Tribes can obtain authority to:

Regulate air resources and emissions within the exterior bounds of the reservation or other areas within the tribe's jurisdiction







# Eligibility requirements

- Federal recognition
- Governing body and tribal government
- Description of proposed management and protection of air resources
- Demonstrate capability



#### Swinomish TIP for open burning

#### Tribal code:

Regulates open burning within exterior bounds to protect the airshed from exceedances of CO,  $PM_{2.5}$  and  $PM_{10}$  standards

- Rules for open burning
- Permits for large open and special burning
- Burn bans during stagnation events and other high risk days
- Fees for violations





# Four major steps for TAS

- Tribes submit application
- EPA reviews submitted materials
- Comment period
- Final TAS decision

#### SECTION V - BURN PLAN INFORMATION

The following must be submitted separately as part of the burn plan:

- Plot or other map showing area of proposed burn; location of proposed burn in relation to
  property line and vehicle access to property; and an indication of distances to any structures
  and other combustible materials within 200 feet of the proposed burn site
- · Description of measures taken to prevent escaped fires
- Name, mailing address, and telephone number of person responsible for conducting the proposed open burn (if different than the applicant).

#### SECTION VI - SIGNATURE BLOCK

Application is hereby made for a permit to authorize the activities described herein. I certify that I am familiar with the information contained in this application, and that to the best of my knowledge and belief, such information is true, complete, and accurate. If further certify that I possess the authority to undertake the proposed activities. I hereby grant to the officials of the Swinomish Indian
Tribal Community the right to enter the above-described location to inspect the proposed or completed work.
