"Well things are getting back on track since the beginning of the pandemic."

"We have had the guys dig a small pond for minnows and install a broken cistern for the tiniest fish (starters)."

"As suggested from the course Wagner took from a fish farm."

"The workers were paid with sails that were brought down by another sailor from donations given to Bruce."

"We also have started adding ducks to the coups, they seem much more disease resistant and the eggs are sold for more and they love the pond."

"Another 'coup' we have, by Wagner's house, we received it through a guy who had it built and came and went."



"Wagner put in an area for the ducks to have water in one end of that coup."

"The duck eggs are considered more nutritious, I have not verified that, but what I have been told by Bruce. We feed them corn."



"Duck eggs are bigger than I thought they would be."

"Bruce's wife Judy, sent money at Xmas for a celebration for the community."

"They had rice, vegetables, fruit and seafood that was purchased by Judy."



"And they harvested some fish,"
