This applies to anyone who has been in Adelaide since 9th November, eg if you are in WA but have been in Adelaide last week and are planning to come to Queensland shortly then you will be made to quarantine and have a COVID test.  The Chief Health Officer has urged ALL people who have recently arrived from Adelaide to get tested and self-isolate.
