WEST TORONTO RAILPATH EXTENSION



COME SEE THE FUTURE

The City of Toronto has finalized the design details for extending the West Toronto Railpath multi-use trail south from Dundas Street West at Sterling Road to Abell Street at Sudbury Street (see map on reverse side). Join us to review the final design elements (i.e. bridges, landscaping, community connections) and learn more about the project and timelines.

The future Railpath Extension is planned to be a wonderful multi-use trail linking communities for active transportation, recreation, public art and fun.

Goals of the Railpath Extension

- Connect the downtown cycling network to waterfront with a new multi-use trail separated from motor vehicle traffic from Dundas Street West/Sterling Road to Queen Street/Abell Street
- Improve safety and comfort for all trail users
- Support healthy neighbourhoods with community connections to services and amenities
- Accommodate public art, community events and green space
- Futureproof for further Railpath expansion
- Support Toronto's Official Plan as well as the TransformTO, the Cycling Network Plan and the Vision Zero Road Safety Plan

Background

An Environmental Assessment study was completed in spring 2016 that determined the preferred trail alignment and location of access points to local streets between Dundas Street at Sterling Road and to Abell Street at Sudbury Street.

Most of the Railpath Extension is located within the Metrolinx-owned rail corridor, and so the preferred alignment was determined in coordination with Metrolinx. Since February 2018, the City of Toronto in partnership with Metrolinx, has developed the detailed design to get it construction-ready and worked with affected stakeholders to reduce impacts, develop access points, and incorporate placemaking, art and culture.
