

A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

As you know, the Vestry has been reading, studying and talking about what might be done to ensure St. John's growth to a stable and lasting future. We've seen several new families recently, which is very encouraging! We have a great little secret here and we need to get it out!



One of the things we are learning is that we are more likely to find what we need in small experiments rather than dramatic, wholesale re-writing of the life of the congregation. As a church there are no major issues, no grand simmering conflicts, nothing boiling over. Sure there's a rub here, an annoyance there, this or that thing that could be done better, and we strive to address those things as appropriate. But there is nothing "immediately life-threatening," if I may borrow a medical term. In such a situation, we are learning, it is better to make small adjustments than anything too big that might create its own set of problems.

At our vestry retreat in early May, one of the items we discussed is an attempt to re-invigorate an idea we have worked on before: small groups. First, let me say that this does not mean that everyone needs to join an evening Bible study in someone's home (although I'd be thrilled, there are other ways to accomplish this goal).

Let me briefly lay out the principles that make this so important, and the essential elements.

There are many ways to lay out what the purpose of a church is. St. John's has the following statement:

Mission

St John's is a worshipping community, obedient to scripture, growing as servants of Christ, and sharing His love in word and deed.

Core Values

We are Biblical Christians, acting in all matters with integrity, serving others before ourselves, and striving for excellence in all we do. We are members of the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion. We worship within the Anglican tradition.

Vision

With God's help: We reach out to our community to meet human need and invite others to St. John's. We endeavor to be disciples of Jesus Christ, providing our members opportunities for spiritual growth, learning and service. We enrich our worship to provide a more uplifting experience for all and to attract new members.

Underneath all this is the conviction that God wants to bring about real life change for our membership and beyond through the life and work of the church. We are not here to make ourselves feel good, or maintain a beautiful building, although those things may be part of our work.

If real life change for Christ is the goal, I believe that happens more effectively walking with a small group of known and trusted fellow disciples. Good worship alone is not enough. Service alone is not enough. Christian education alone is not enough. It takes all these things together in a nurturing community that most effectively leads us into real life change.

If we're serious about real life change, then we should be deliberate about creating those kinds of life transforming relationships. Just like building strong families or lasting friendships, we need to invest time, effort, and love into building those relationships.

They can (and should) take many shapes. As soon as I say "small groups," most of us think of a little Bible study group meeting on some weeknight in someone's home – great for some, terror for others and just ho-hum for still others. But lots of things can be small groups if we're intentional about it.

The essential elements as I see it are: 1) fellowship and support, 2) some kind of study of our faith and how we live it out, 3) prayer, and 4) service to others. I think its fine for some groups to be mainly fellowship, some mainly study, some mainly prayer and some mainly service, but all should include some of each element.

Let me flesh that out regarding how we are putting that model to work in the choir. They already have fellowship and support – no need to plan that, just the normal chatting and catching up happens regardless. Their service is to lead the music in our Sunday worship (some service is within the congregation, some beyond). I have asked them to be a bit more deliberate about including some study, which might be a brief Bible study or a discussion of the lyrics of some music being worked on, and prayer, which they are now doing.

Other "small groups" might do the same thing – altar guild, flower guild, coffee hour team, Daily Bread teams, Family Promise teams, etc. Of course, there will continue to be the more conventional "Bible studies" as well, and we have plans to start a couple of new ones in the fall. What we want to strive for over the coming months is for all of us to become more aware of this need in our lives and to build it in wherever we can.

As this develops, it will also feed the need for changes that will help St. John's grow to a sustainable future. What grows churches is being a good church where people find real life change. The more we are deliberate about being that kind of church, the more our members will want to share it and the more others will want to be a part of it!

Midyear Treasurer's Report

The Vestry approved budget for 2019 was \$215,153 which for the first time in several years covered our projected expenses of the same amount. In the month of May we incurred a monthly deficit of (\$1,680) which brought our Year to Date deficit to (\$4,931).

The projection for total expenses through May was \$89,641; Actual expenses were \$89,489. Pretty darn close! However, projected income has been short over \$4,000 during the same time period.

For 2019 we have received 57 pledges. Through May there are approximately 25% of our pledgers are running behind their annual projected pledge. This reduction in income has reduced our Operating Cash at the end of May to \$3,150. Our bi-weekly payroll for salaries, income taxes and Social Security/Medicare amount to \$4,380. At the June Vestry meeting I will present a motion that I can transfer additional Operating funds from the Restricted Reserve account (current balance is \$7,070) if needed to cover any Operating expenses if Sunday giving does not increase.

There are several initiatives in process that will enable St John's to improve the current financial status. The vestry continues to try to reduce costs. We have cancelled our current office printer and have selected a new vendor that should save several hundred dollars a month. James House has now been rented which will help increase income the second half of the year. And best of all, we have added several new members who have submitted pledge cards.

Thank you for your continued support of St. John's! Please review your current status and if behind, bring your giving up to date if at all possible. Thank you!

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Outreach Focus



For July and August, the Outreach Focus will be our ministry with Family Promise of Brevard. Each week of hosting costs \$300 – 400. Some needs are covered by in kind donations but this fund helps us cover the additional expenses that may come up in being good hosts.

Contributions in the blue or lavender envelopes in the pew racks or clearly marked for outreach will replenish St. John's Restricted Fund for Family Promise of Brevard.

Successful Family Promise Hosting in May

Our St. John's Family Promise team successfully hosted two families the week of May 19th despite a visit from a mouse to the Flower House which we used to house one family. The nursery was the other primary facility we used as housing. The families included three adults and five children ages 14, 12, 8, 4, and 2.

The family in the Flower House was delighted with it, but the mouse appeared the third night, Tuesday, and we then moved the family to the parish hall. A lot of effort had been made prior to the hosting week to eradicate any and all pests, and it seemed to be successful, but alas the best efforts weren't enough. However, since the hosting, we have done considerably more and it now seems certain we have removed any remaining rodents. The Flower House is an excellent facility for the families and we intend to continue to use it.

The Family Promise program takes considerable effort by many members of our congregation. A very sincere thank you to all our volunteers who helped with this hosting. It is a very rewarding experience and an important part of the area wide program to eliminate family homelessness. The next hosting is October 13-20, 2019.

Family Promise is the Outreach program for July and August. Expenses are not excessive and with generous contributions during Outreach we can continue to operate our program without other fund raising.

Solar Light for Africa 20th Anniversary Mission

Charlene and Eric Turner will be leading the 20th Anniversary SLA Summer Mission July 3 – 18. We have a great and diverse team, including Bishop Alden Hathaway and his son Alden, II who founded the organization and lead it for many years. This summer we will have a team of 13 Americans and about 10 Ugandans.



We have enjoyed the wonderful support of “Mama” Janet Museveni, the First Lady of Uganda and also the Cabinet Secretary for Education and Sports. In thanksgiving, she was asked to select two sites for us to work, so we will begin our work at two schools near Kampala, the capital city. While there is grid power available, there are two big problems. First, it is very expensive, costing about 4X what we pay per kilowatt hour, and this in a country where the per capita income is less than \$2 per day, so it means that many such schools don’t have power simply because they can’t afford it. The second problem is that “load shedding” is a regular occurrence so the power is unreliable. The schools will now have dependable, affordable and clean power.

Then we are travel to Jinja, another major city on the shore of Lake Victoria, about 60 miles east of Kampala. There we will work again with a British NGO (non-governmental organization) called Soft Power Education, which refurbishes rural schools helping with physical structures, teacher training, administration training, curriculum and whatever else may be needed. As teachers are paid very poorly in Uganda, it is often very helpful to provide on-site housing, and that housing is all the more attractive with a solar power system, so that is our contribution to the work. This is a great help in hiring and retaining good teachers, which, as we know, is at the heart of any school.

We will also visit some sites where we have worked in the past and sites where we hope to work in the future. And no trip to Uganda would be complete without a short safari and a little time to enjoy the natural wonders of this beautiful country.

Thanks again to the people of St. John’s for your support of this ministry over the years, for your generous support both when SLA was the Outreach Focus for the month of May and for all the money donated for Deacon Elizabeth’s gift supplies to go this summer!

Please pray for the team, for safe travel, good work, and a new vision for service when we return home.

School of Healing Prayer

*When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. **Luke 9: 1-2***



Praying and praying for one another are essential to the Christian life. Yet there is so much more that God can do in our lives through prayer! Indeed, healing prayer as a way to allow God to address and heal many burdens we carry is a tremendous gift, but there is much to learn and do if we are to take advantage of what God has given us.

St. John’s has successfully completed our first Level 1 Level 2 classes in the School of Healing Prayer.

Level 1 will be offered again, this time on Thursday evenings, beginning September 12, 2019. This course will be offered to other churches and denominations in the Melbourne area.

Daily Devotions for Families and Individuals

An hour a week is not enough to build a growing and meaningful relationship with God. We strongly recommend a daily discipline of time with God, individually or as a family.

It is best to keep it simple and achievable – something you will actually do on a regular basis.

Try a simple format. Below is a basic outline and some simple prayers to get you started, but remember, prayers don't have to sound good, they have to be from the heart. Whether your prayers are the equivalent of a kindergartner's drawing, or a great work of eloquence and balance, He is pleased to hear from you!

We are pleased to make available to you, at no cost, a daily devotional guide called "The Upper Room." The current edition can be found on the table as you enter the Parish Hall.

Many find it helps to have a pad and pen nearby so that you can write down things that come to your mind. If you believe the Lord is speaking to you, writing it down will help you remember it clearly so you can pray about it later, or talk with a trusted friend. If it is just the normal "brain clutter" then writing it down can allow you to forget it until later rather than remain distracted. Turn off your phone, TV, etc.

Daily devotions do not need to be perfect, or long. They just need to be done! If you miss one day, don't despair – just start up again the next day. This is one case where Nike got it right: Just do it!

Come before God in quiet

Try praying a portion of Psalm 51:

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Give me the joy of your saving help again and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit. Open my lips, O Lord, and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Now take a few moments to name before God your thanksgivings, concerns, and special prayer requests.

Read the Bible

There are many patterns for reading the Bible. If you're not using another one, we suggest starting with the book of Luke and just read one story or section. Remember, it is more important to read it than to read it just right or understand everything perfectly!

Plan for Action

Take a few minutes to reflect on what you have read. Ask "What would God have me do, or think, or believe differently today because of what I have read?"

Closing Prayer

Almighty and eternal God, so draw my heart to you, so guide my mind, so fill my imaginations, so control my will, that I may be completely yours, utterly dedicated to you; and then use me, I pray, as you will, and always to your glory and the welfare of your people; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

May Vestry Notes

On May 5, the vestry held a productive retreat. For more about this, see the Rector's letter on page 1 of this "Good News." And we thank Kathy Oas who once again hosted our meeting and provided us a delicious lunch!

The regularly scheduled meeting was held on Thursday, May 15. In the Treasurer's absence, Fr. Eric presented the finance report for the month ending April 30, 2019. The month ended with a surplus \$2,992 compared to the expected surplus for the month of \$3,122. A concern to monitor is the year to date deficit, which is \$3,251 and almost \$3,000 more than the budgeted deficit for the year to date. The Yellow House, formerly known as the Flower House, had the following updates in anticipation of the first FPOB hosting: large fridge moved out, thorough cleaning, front door repaired and painted, screen door installed, and shower operational, but cold water only. We thank especially Dennis Stitzel and Lee Steinger for this work.

Sale of Property Update: The Diocesan Real Estate Committee notified St. John's it will wait to act on the property sale request upon the Bishop's return in August.

June Vestry Notes

The vestry met on Thursday, June 20. Steve Bradley presented the Treasurer's report for the period ending May 31, 2019. The financial result were revenues \$362 less than budget and expenses \$1,064 more than budget. The month ended with deficit of \$1,680. The deficit for the year to date is \$4,931 the bulk of which is attributable to collected pledge dollars less than pledged at the beginning of the fiscal year. He has prepared a Mid-Year Report for the Good News.

The Vestry reviewed the St. John's Mission Statement, Core Values, and Vision Statement in an effort to define the grounding principals (church DNA) which must be preserved as we navigate any changes to be made to preserve and propel Christianity and St. John's into the future. New small groups can be expected to form in the fall.

Plans for Fr. Eric's summer schedule and backup were reviewed. The next Vestry meeting will be held August 15. There is no meeting in July.
