## A WORD FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Margaret Mead (a professor of cultural anthropology in the mid 1900's) rather famously said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has."

And how did Jesus change the world? Yes, he came, died on the cross and rose on Easter. But what was the strategy to let people know of this and draw others to trust in his work? He gathered a small group of folks, invested enough with them to get them fully committed, then he sent them out.

This is the formula, whether we want to change the whole world, or our community, or our church! A small group of committed folks.

In the church, we call them disciples. And how are disciples built? One by one, in small committed groups. But those take many forms and we want to be more deliberate about exploiting them.

You may recall that I wrote in the last newsletter about doing more with helping our existing groups be more deliberate about including intentional discipleship in their normal group activities. The last year of newsletters is available there, but this article is in the July-August 2019 issue.

Over the fall, we will work on fleshing that out. To that end, I will begin meeting one on one with the coordinators of various ministries to explore exactly how this might happen in each setting.

For September, the Outreach Focus will be the Children's Hunger Project, providing pre-packaged meals that require no cooking and are distributed directly into qualifying elementary aged children's backpacks on Friday afternoons. Qualification is determined solely at the discretion of the teacher and requires no parental involvement. The meals are designed to meet minimum nutritional requirements for the weekend and require no parental supervision or assistance.

# Property Sale

Members may recall that the possible sale of a small portion of St. John's property at the west end of the lot (now just grass parking) has been under discussion for some time, and was discussed at great length at our last Annual Parish Meeting. The accompanying satellite photo shows the approximate area to be sold. We have had a couple of offers and checked the value with a local appraiser to be sure that we are receiving a fair price.



The appraiser's opinion is the property is worth \$20,000 – 25,000 per "buildable lot" and the parcel is 4½ buildable lots. The vestry accepted the highest bid of \$150,000 from Bob Stitzel who plans to develop it as residential housing. Not only did Bob submit the highest bid on the property, but we are very comfortable that Bob will not develop anything there that would be detrimental to the church.

The permission of the Diocese is required for the sale of church owned property, so the proposal was submitted to the Diocese in February 2019. The Property Commission, who is tasked with evaluating such things, recommended that permission be denied on the general principal of not selling church property. We learned of this only a couple of days prior to the March meeting of the Diocesan Board, who has final say in the matter. Fr. Eric Turner and Jr. Warden Kathy Oas attended that meeting and made our case directly to the Board. They asked us to investigate two matters, then return for consent: first, we needed to ensure that we would still have adequate parking and, second, see what could be done to ensure that what is developed would be "affordable housing." The parking matter was simple as even with the loss of those spaces we have nearly double the required parking available.

The affordable housing issue is a bit more complicated. There is no set definition of "affordable" housing and no single government entity that administers it. It is a collection of tax breaks and other things at various levels of government, in some cases tied to the property, in other cases to the resident. These advantages are often reserved for larger developments than what would be happening here. We have agreed with Bob Stitzel that a good faith effort will be made, but it cannot be assured. Family Promise of Brevard may also be able to help in this matter.

Having investigated these matters and obtaining letters from Bob Stitzel and Family Promise to make a good faith effort to develop this as affordable housing, the matter was re-submitted. Following a delay while the Bishop was on sabbatical, Fr. Eric and Kathy attended the August 2019 meeting of the Diocesan Board and obtained permission for the sale of the parcel. As of this writing, we are awaiting attorney review, title insurance, etc. but expect to complete the sale early in the fall.

No firm commitments have been made regarding the use of the funds but the vestry is in agreement that these funds should not just supplement the general operating budget. Possibilities would include:

- 1) A consultant to help St. John's determine the best path toward a sustainable future. We anticipate something in the range of \$5,000.
- 2) Several roofs need to be replaced, including portions of the office building and at least two of our outbuildings. Based on estimates, this would like be \$35,000 to 50,000.
- 3) We have three electrical boxes that are outdated and should be replaced. The estimate we have obtained for this work is \$3,800. Additionally, we would like to finish upgrading the lighting in the offices, parish hall, kitchen and sacristies to replace the fluorescent fixtures with LED's. Doing this work with volunteers, we would probably spend less than \$1,000.
- 4) We may replace the flooring in the parish hall. No estimates yet on this work but could vary widely based on materials selected, and additional repairs needed. We expect \$5-10,000.
- 5) We currently carry an internal debt to our Restricted Funds of \$11,705 which we would eliminate. This has been paid down from a high of slightly over \$30,000.
- 6) We have a variety of other, smaller, projects outlined in our Long Range Property Plan (available from the church office).

Remaining balance of sale proceeds would be conservatively invested to make them available for special outreach projects or other future needs.



# Walk the Talk with Family Promise

**“With God’s help we reach out to our community to meet human needs”**

This sentence contains a phrase from St. John’s Vision Statement. Lets walk this talk as a congregation with Family Promise!



**We need more volunteers!** It’s that simple. Our final Family Promise hosting for 2019 is scheduled for October 13-20. Lets come together as a church community and each one of us take a responsibility in this hosting. There is something for everyone! Here’s what it takes.

**Overnight Hosts:** Spend one night at St. John’s arriving approximately 8 pm. A comfortable cot is provided with your own sheets, blanket, and pillow. If you prefer, linens are provided. You are welcome to share dinner with the guest families at 6 pm, if desired. Responsibilities are basically to respond to families needs. Next day departure is about 7 am.

**Dinner Hosts:** This is a wonderful opportunity to share dinner with our families and other St. John’s volunteers. They enjoy your company, conversation, interest, and appreciate your just being there and caring. You will find this is a very rewarding experience. If you interacted with one of our recent families, David and Arjai, you would never forget that wonderful experience. Those who did, received more than they gave.

**Dinner Preparation Hosts:** We provide a hot dinner nightly. We need volunteers to donate their time and resources to prepare just one night’s meal. Not a cook? Donate funds, food, materials needed to prepare a meal.

**Saturday Hosts:** The families have a “down” day Saturday. We host them all day Saturday if they have no off campus plans. We need two people on duty all day, normally for 2-3 hour shifts. Saturday hosting requires simply being at the Parrish hall and being able to respond to family requests for information or support.

This is our third year hosting Family Promise families. We are extremely blessed to have hosted 26 families most of whom have found housing and are self sustaining. It is very unlikely they would have been successful without Family Promise.

# Vestry Notes

The Vestry met on Thursday, August 15. Steve Bradley presented the Treasurer’s report for the period ending July 31, 2019 (June financials had been distributed earlier). The financial result were revenues \$1,923 less than budget and expenses \$96 more than budget. The month ended with deficit of \$3,523. The deficit for the year to date is \$7,666 the bulk of which is attributable to collected pledge dollars is less than amounts that were pledged at the beginning of the fiscal year.

Fr. Eric and Kathy Oas returned from meeting with the Diocesan Board and provided an update on the status of the sale of property (see related article). The Vestry discussed physical plant needs (leaking roof, old flooring, antiquated phone system) and how to prioritize and address them. A fall clean-up day will be organized by Kathy Oas to perform some clean-up and maintenance tasks on the campus. The School of Healing Prayer will start up in January 2020. Additional Memorial Garden funds will be invested in building the foundation and cinder blocks for the next wall in the Memorial Garden.

**The next Vestry meeting will be held September 19. There was no meeting in July.**

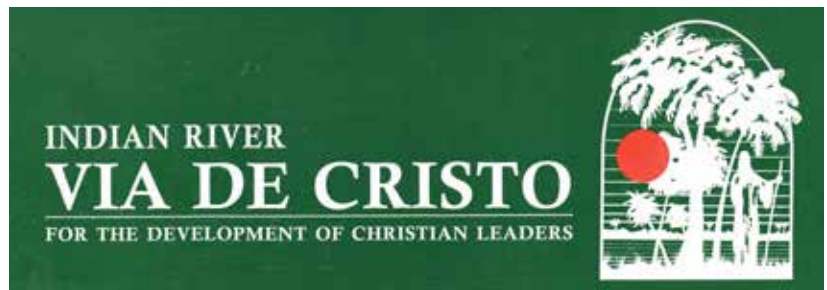
