## The Lessons

*All sit*

### Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"

But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

**DRIVE-IN WORSHIP:** At 5:00 p.m. on **Saturday** we offer a "drive-in" worship in our park on the south side of Young Street. We will set up at the outdoor altar, you will drive in and park on the grass, or sit in chairs. Communion (bread only) will be delivered to

your car.

**IN-PERSON WORSHIP BACK TODAY AT 10:00 A.M!** This service will continue to be live streamed. There will be several changes to keep everyone safe. There will be no 7:45 service as we cannot adequately clean the sanctuary between the services. There will be no passing of the peace, coffee hour, hugging or shaking hands. All are asked to maintain 6 ft. social distancing and 2 of 3 pews are marked off. Everyone is expected to wear a face mask. If you do not have one, we will have a supply. Everyone will be expected to use hand sanitizer upon entry and it will be available throughout the service. We are limited to 25% capacity, so for us that is about 45 people.

**SUNDAY BECOMES SATURDAY!** To ease the pressure and give more options, the evening service will continue, but it will move to Saturday at 5 p.m. Worshipers will have the option of sitting in your car, or sitting in chairs (bring your own or use St. John's), appropriately distanced. This provides stronger social distancing for those who still feel vulnerable and will continue as long as participation warrants.
