Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you

made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

The Holy Eucharist is Christ's eternal banquet, to which all adults and children are invited. If you are a baptized Christian of any tradition (and regardless of your current status in any other church) we welcome you to receive communion with this community of God's people. DRIVE-IN WORSHIP: At 5:00 p.m. on **Saturday** we offer a "drive-in" worship in our park on the south side of Young Street. We will set up at the outdoor altar, you will drive in and park on the grass, or sit in chairs. Communion (bread only) will be delivered to your car. This service will continue as long as participation warrants.

IN-PERSON WORSHIP BACK AT 10:00 A.M! This service will continue to be live streamed. There are several changes to keep everyone safe. There will be no 7:45 service as we cannot adequately clean the sanctuary between the services. There will be no passing of the peace, coffee hour, hugging or shaking hands.
