The clinic will take place at Nathan Goff Armory, located at 5 Armory Road, Clarksburg, WV.

Persons who have been contacted for vaccines should arrive at the Armory at your scheduled time. Masks should be worn to enter site. To prevent unnecessary wait times and traffic congestion, do not arrive early. Everyone who is scheduled has an assigned vaccine.
