

LESSON SNAPSHOT

BOTTOM LINE:

God's love never fails.

OBJECTIVE:

Kids will learn that God's love never fails, even though we as people do fail.

KEY PASSAGE:

Genesis 6:13-7:24, Noah

MEMORY VERSE:

"He determines the number of the stars and calls them each by name. Great is our Lord and mighty in power; his understanding has no limit." Psalm 147:4-5 (NIV)

SUMMARY:

When the world had become corrupt and the people's wickedness was complete, God showed His greatness by sending rain on the earth for 40 days to destroy it all. But God's love remained even greater – saving Noah and his family from harm.

SIMPLE PRAYER:

Dear God,

Thank you for your amazing love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

MAKE IT STICK:

Make this week's lesson real:

When it rains this week, look for the rainbow after the storm. Ask the kids if they remember why God made rainbows and what promise they represent.

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why did God tell Noah to build an ark?
- How long did it rain?
- What does Noah's story teach us about God's love?

PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

God saved Noah, his family, and all the animals because of his love. Even though the world was a mess, God chose to save part of Creation and start over. Spend some time this week thanking God for His love and remind your kids every night that God loves them.
