#### **MISSION**



#### Some facts about the Austin Symphony Orchestra

- Founded in 1911, ASO is the oldest performing group in Austin, Texas.
- Nearly 80 musicians form the ASO.
- The ASO provides approximately 90,000 children with an opportunity to learn about symphony music through various programs offered throughout the year.
- Bass Concert Hall at the University of Texas served as the ASO's longtime performance hall until the Long Center for Performing Arts was opened in 2008.
- Musicians who have performed with the ASO include Van Cliburn, Yo-Yo Ma, Itzhak Perlman, Isaac Stern, and André Watts.
- Peter Bay is ASO's eighth and longest running conductor, now in his 22nd season.
- The ASO hosts an annual Young Composers competition. 2020 will be the 10th year for the competition which is held each spring and named for Sarah and Ernest Butler, longtime patrons of the Symphony.
