In-person Worship @ Trinity — Sunday @ 8 AM

With new COVID infections and hospitalizations on the decline AND a high rate of vaccination within our congregation, the Bishop has approved a plan for us to allow for in-person worship at Trinity.

Here are a few details you should know:

- We will limit attendance to 60 persons as we start. **If you hope/plan to attend on a given Sunday, call the church office no later than 4 pm on the previous Friday to reserve a place.**
- The liturgy will be relatively simple. Communion will be offered in one kind (i.e., wafer only, no wine).
- Childcare will not be provided. The noise of children will be welcome.
- We encourage everyone to be vaccinated, but we will not ask anyone to prove that they are (and some of our members are too young to be eligible in any event). Please wear a mask while indoors.
- As far as is practicable, we will observe physical-distancing and discourage physical interactions.
- We will not offer a social hour following worship, but you are free to gather out in front of Trinity informally after worship. (Bring your own coffee or tea.)

These past months have been an enormous challenge for us all. Thank you for the support you have given.

Second Sunday Cinema: La Grande Illusion — TODAY @ 4/6 PM

Just ahead of Bastille Day, we'll see and/or talk about one of the most important films in world cinema, **La Grande Illusion**. Directed by Jean Renoir (son of the famous impressionist painter) in 1937, the film follows the experiences of two French soldiers captured by the Germans in WWI. It takes a humanist view of all the characters, including the German aristocrat played by Erich von Stroheim. Hitler's propaganda minister, Joseph Goebbels, is said to have called this "Cinematic Public Enemy #1" but his was a lone voice.

This movie offers plenty to discuss in our 6 pm Zoom meeting, as decades of film students would tell you. The movie is easily available on several streaming platforms and of course you're welcome to watch it at 4 pm as it is streamed through Zoom. (Dr.) Kake Huck hosts this series.
