The Alex: Changing Health. Changing Lives. The Alex Community Health Centre is a not-for-profit organization that is changing how we look at health care in Calgary. Our health, housing and food programs support our most vulnerable neighbours, tackling tough health and social issues head-on. Using a multi-disciplinary team approach, we focus care on assessment, intervention and promotion of all aspects of health. We embrace a model of health care that is accessible, responsive and participatory. In addition to the Family Health Centre, we run a Seniors Health Centre, a Youth Centre, two Mobile Community Health Buses, one Dental Health Bus, four Housing First Programs, and a Community Food Centre.

What we do and why we do it:

The pandemic response continues to evolve which requires a team that will have flexibility in their delivery of care. The Government of Alberta has identified that it is critical to have an Assisted Self Isolation Site (ASIS) for Calgary's vulnerable homeless individuals who otherwise do not have homes to self-isolate should they become symptomatic or ill with COVID-19. Our target population is Calgary area only, homeless persons with symptoms who have been tested in the community and require self-isolation while waiting for results; COVID-infected homeless persons requiring self-isolation while their illness resolves; homeless persons who have symptoms or have come into contact with a known case and don't have a home where they can properly isolate. The ASIS team will provide medical, mental health, addictions, and housing supports in a 24/7 operation of care.

As a part of the multidisciplinary team, the RN completes clinic and community health duties to ensure our clients are receiving quality and holistic care practices within their scope of practice. Knowledge of chronic disease, mental health, and substance use as well as familiarity with the homeless serving sector is vital to the role. Willingness and ability to work weekend and overnight awake shifts is preferred. Shifts and layout of site also require the ability to walk up and down stairs (up to 3 flights) with lots of walking and some heavy lifting. This is a casual position.

What you will do:

- Work in Charge Nurse capacity to coordinate and delegate care for client population alongside a very strong team of LPNs
- Coordinate with Pharmacy and Prescribers to ensure medications are onsite and available
- Use principles of psychiatric rehabilitation to assist clients to move toward independent living in community residences
- Management and administration of medication in conjunction with the Psychiatrist and Family Physician
- Performing assessments, providing education and supporting clients directly in the community
- Develop and facilitate health and wellness groups for clients

**What you bring:**

- Bachelor of Science in Nursing is required
- Current registration with CARNA is mandatory
- Minimum of two years progressive Nursing experience working with clients with mental health and addictions disorders, homelessness, and poverty is preferred
- Able to work independently in the community with clients
- Excellent communication, organizational, advocacy, teaching, and rapport-building skills
- Strong skills in health promotion and illness prevention
- Strong commitment to working with individuals living with severe and persistent mental illness and addictions
- Able to work collaboratively in an interdisciplinary team model and innovative outreach service delivery model
- Experience with community outreach and crisis intervention
- Knowledge of social services and non-profit services in Calgary is an asset
- Experience with group facilitation is an asset
- Ability to multi-task in fast-paced environment
- A satisfactory criminal record clearance is required
- Standard First Aid – Level C CPR & AED are mandatory
- Knowledge of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (UNDRIP) and the Truth and Reconciliation Commissions (TRC) 94 Calls to Action an asset
