

COMPLAINT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

- A. **Complainant:** Detective Matthew Dick of the Bloomington Police Department.
- B. **Place or Objects to be searched:** Kim's Sewing and Accessories, 2412 East Washington, Suite 7B, Bloomington, IL
- C. **Items or Materials to be seized:** 1.) any cell phones or computers; 2.) any weapons or item that could be used as a weapon; 3.) any personal items belonging to Wenlan Tan (Linda) Tyda; 4.) any blood and/or DNA evidence; 5.) any fingerprints, 6.) any wigs, 7.) photographs of the exterior and interior of the vehicle; 8.) any human hair; 9.) any item that could be used as restraints, 10.) any identification materials; 11.) any blood stained clothing
- D. **Probable Cause:** Affiant is a detective with the Bloomington Police Department. As a regular part of affiant's duties, affiant conducts investigations into criminal offenses, interviews witnesses, collects and preserves evidence connected to the investigations. Tan (Linda) Tyda is the mother-in-law of Misook Wang. Misook Wang is employed at Kim's Sewing and Accessories located at 2412 East Washington, Suite 7B, Bloomington, IL. Misook Wang believed that her husband, Don Wang, was cheating on her so she went to his place of employment and asked that he be fired. The owner of the business told Don Wang that he was no longer employed until his personal life was put back in order. Tyda then called the business owner and asked that her son be allowed to return to work. Misook found out that Tyda called the business owner and got very angry. On September 1, 2011 Misook traveled to Tyda's home in Crest Hill, IL and confronts Tyda. Tyda's husband threatens to call police and Misook then leaves. On September 4, 2011 Tyda's son goes to her house because he is flying out of O'Hare Airport at 7:30 pm to Los Angeles, CA. While he is at Tyda's house, Tyda tells him that she received a phone call earlier in the day requesting her translation services for September 5, 2011. The caller asked Tyda to come to Bloomington, IL to the Cub Foods parking lot at 5:30 am on September 5, 2011. Once there, Tyda was to translate for and to transport a client to Chinatown in Chicago. Tyda's son told her to call the client to see if they would wait for his return from Los Angeles so that he could accompany Tyda. Tyda told him that the client wouldn't want to wait and that she was fine doing this job alone. Tyda left her Crest Hill, IL home at 3:15 am on September 5, 2011. She kissed her husband goodbye and that is the last time she was seen or heard from. When Tyda did not return home by the evening hours of September 5, 2011 and he couldn't reach her by phone, Tyda's husband reported her missing to the Crest Hill Police Department. Since Tyda's family lived in Bloomington and her last known whereabouts were in Bloomington, the Crest Hill Police Department requested Bloomington Police Department's assistance. BPD started their investigation and interviewed several people, including Tyda's son. As part of their investigation they also made contact with a hostess at the Hibachi Grill in Bloomington. The hostess tells police that on September 4, 2011 a woman came into the restaurant and asked if anyone spoke Chinese. The hostess replied that she did and the woman offered her \$20 to make a phone call in Chinese to a woman named "Linda". The hostess agreed and went outside to the woman's car. The hostess called "Linda" and asked her to pick up a client at Cub Foods parking lot on September 5, 2011 at 5:30 am. "Linda" agreed to complete the job for \$500. The hostess identified the woman that asked her to make the call as Misook Wang. Police check Tyda's phone records and find a call from Misook Wang's phone at approximately the same time as the hostess reported making a call to "Linda". Surveillance video from Cub Foods on the morning of September 5, 2011 shows Tyda's



vehicle arriving in the parking lot. A vehicle matching the description of Misook Wang's silver Mercedes SUV is then seen arriving on video. It appears that there are two people in Misook Wang's vehicle. There is a struggle and then someone is seen getting into Tyda's vehicle. Both vehicles then leave the parking lot. Tyda and her vehicle have not been seen since and police are trying to locate her to determine her well-being. Misook Wang came to BPD for an interview on September 12, 2011 and was observed to have scratches on her arms. Misook claims that are from "falling" but they could be consistent with being involved in a struggle.


